According to ILGA-Europe's calculation, there were **14,933** candidates for the European Parliament elections 2009 registered in 27 EU Member States. ILGA-Europe worked with its members in all EU Member States and MEP Watch Database Project to make the best effort to reach all candidates. We are aware that it was impossible task to reach absolutely all candidates and inform them all about the campaign and the Pledge.

Nevertheless, ILGA-Europe is very please with the outcome of our campaign as **871 candidates (6%** of all registered candidates across EU) **in 26 EU Member States** have signed our European Elections Pledge (**Table 1**).

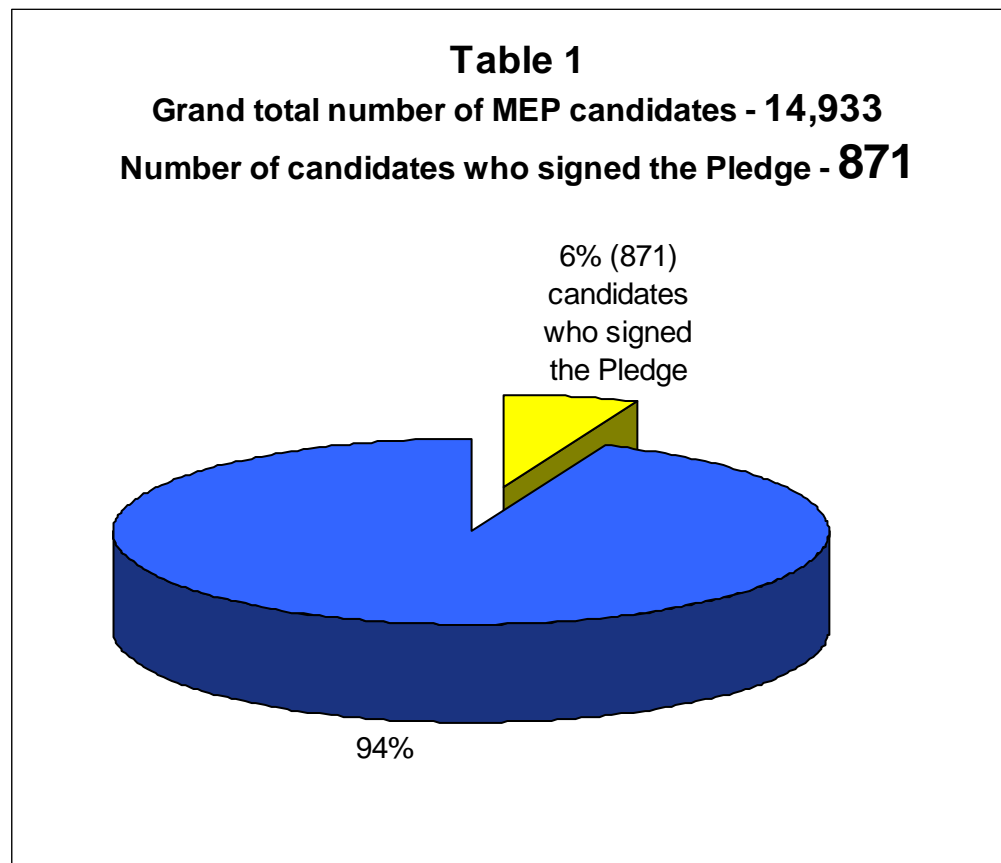


Table 2 represents the numbers of the candidates who signed ILGA-Europe's Pledge by country:

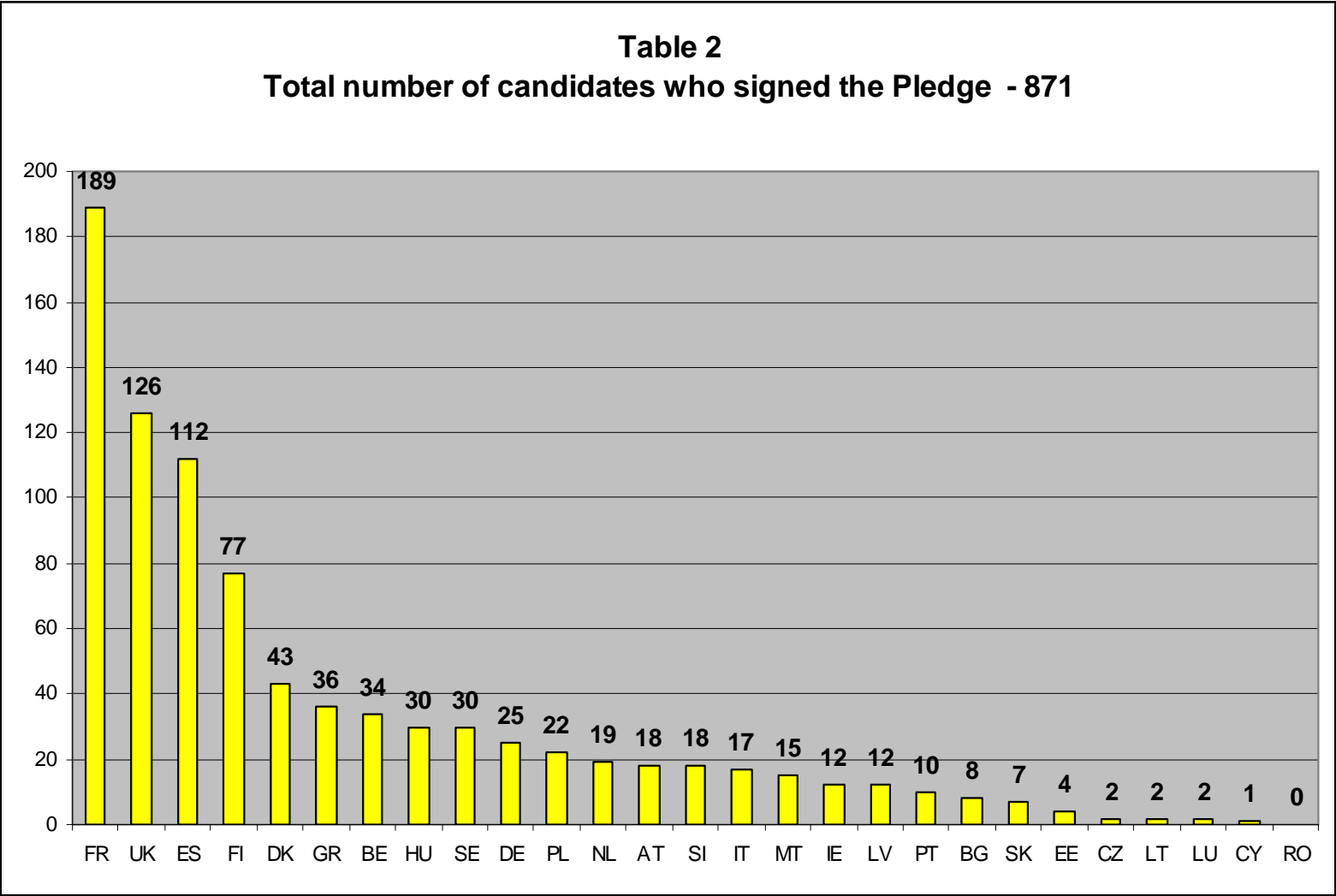


Table 3 represent the percentage of the candidates who signed ILGA-Europe's Pledge of the total number of the candidates by country:

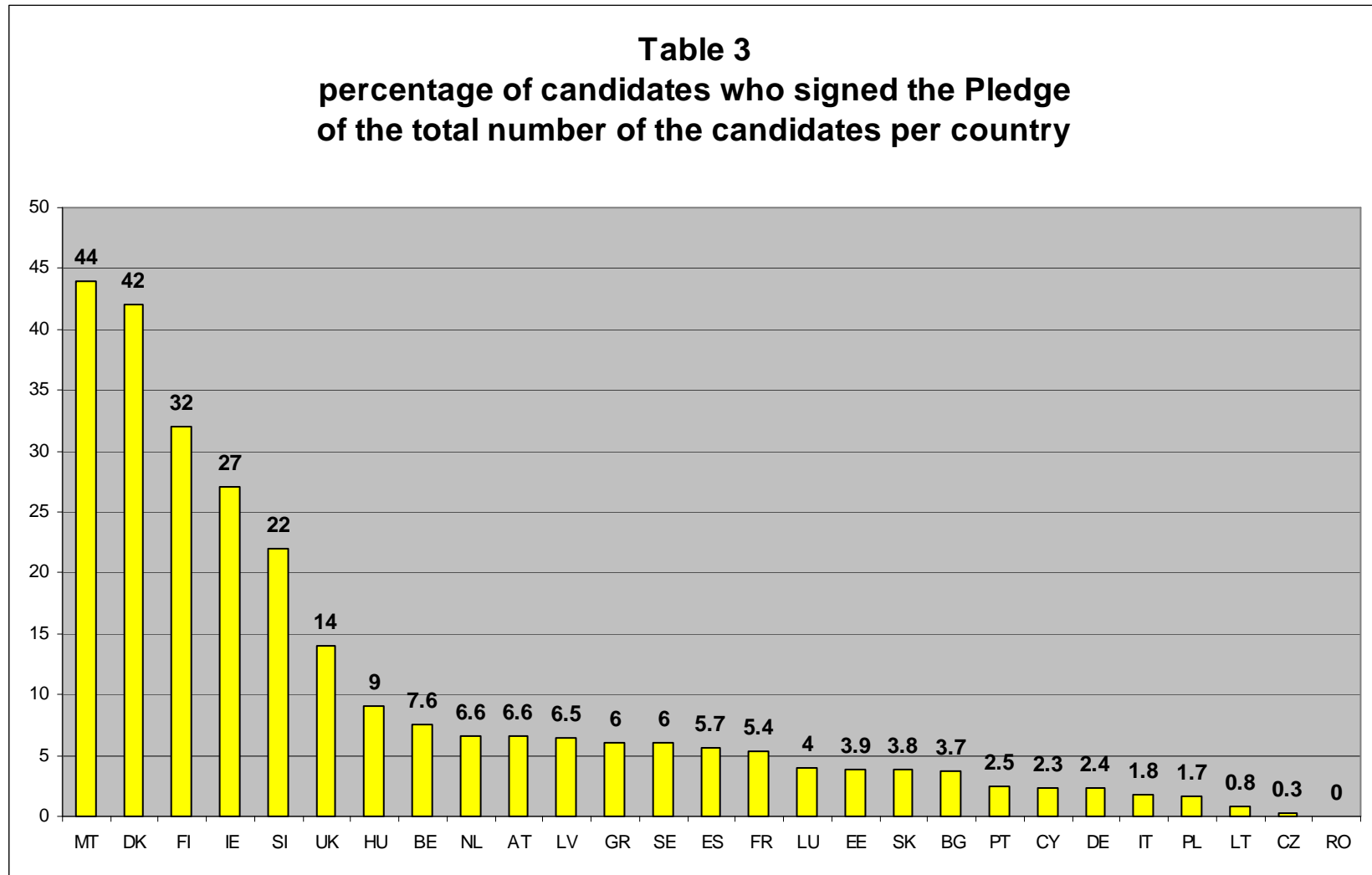

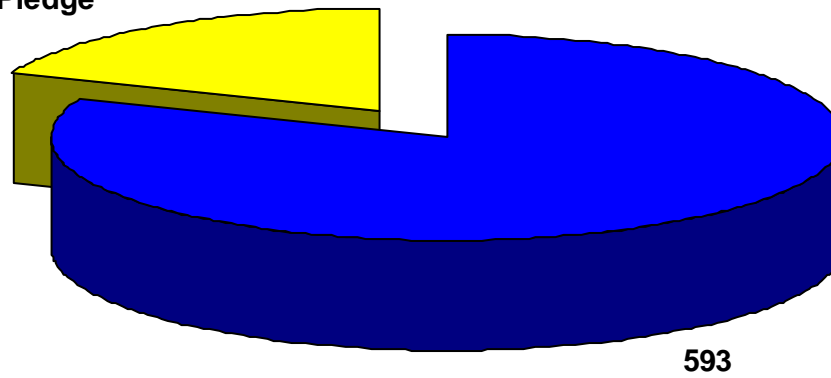

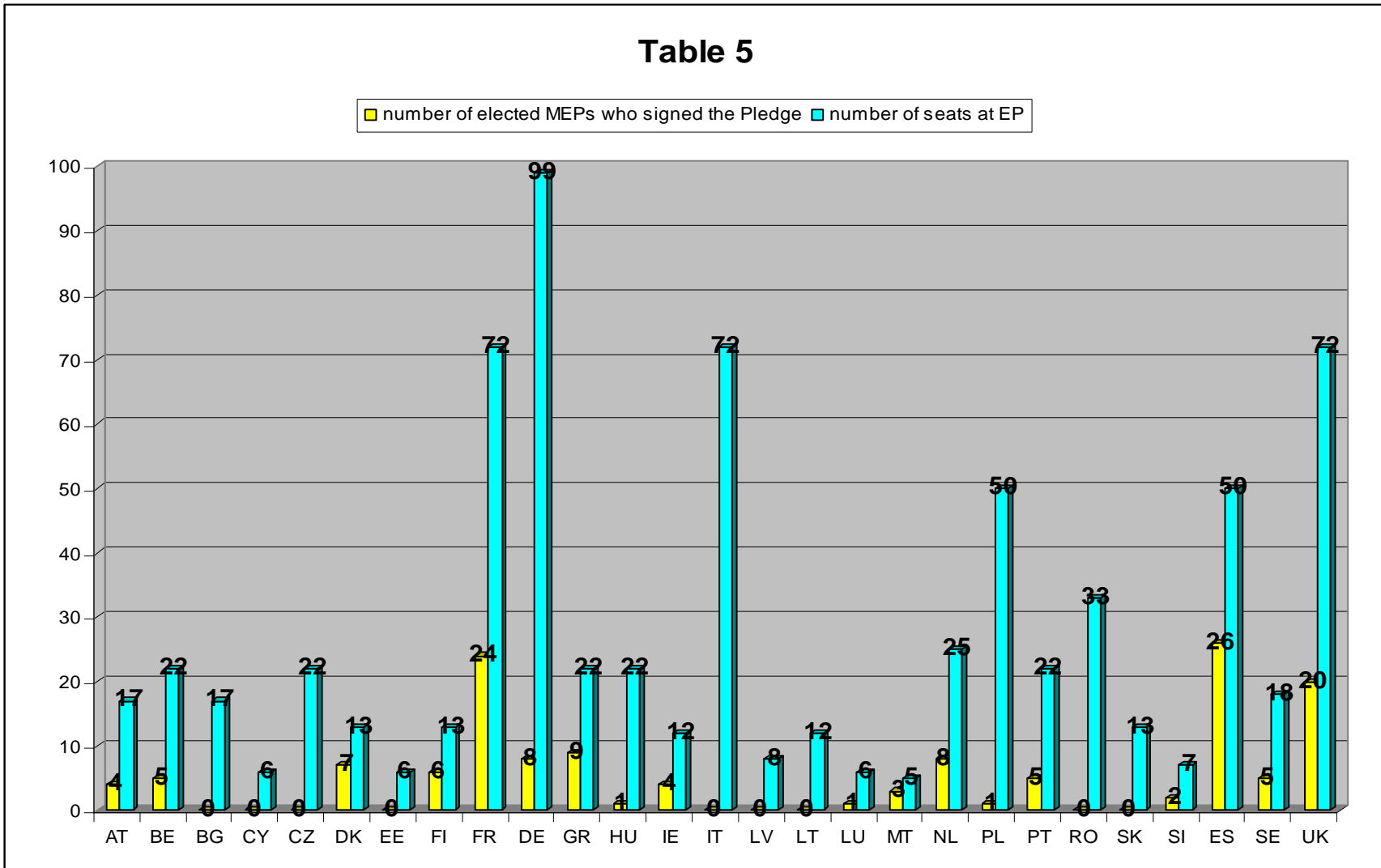
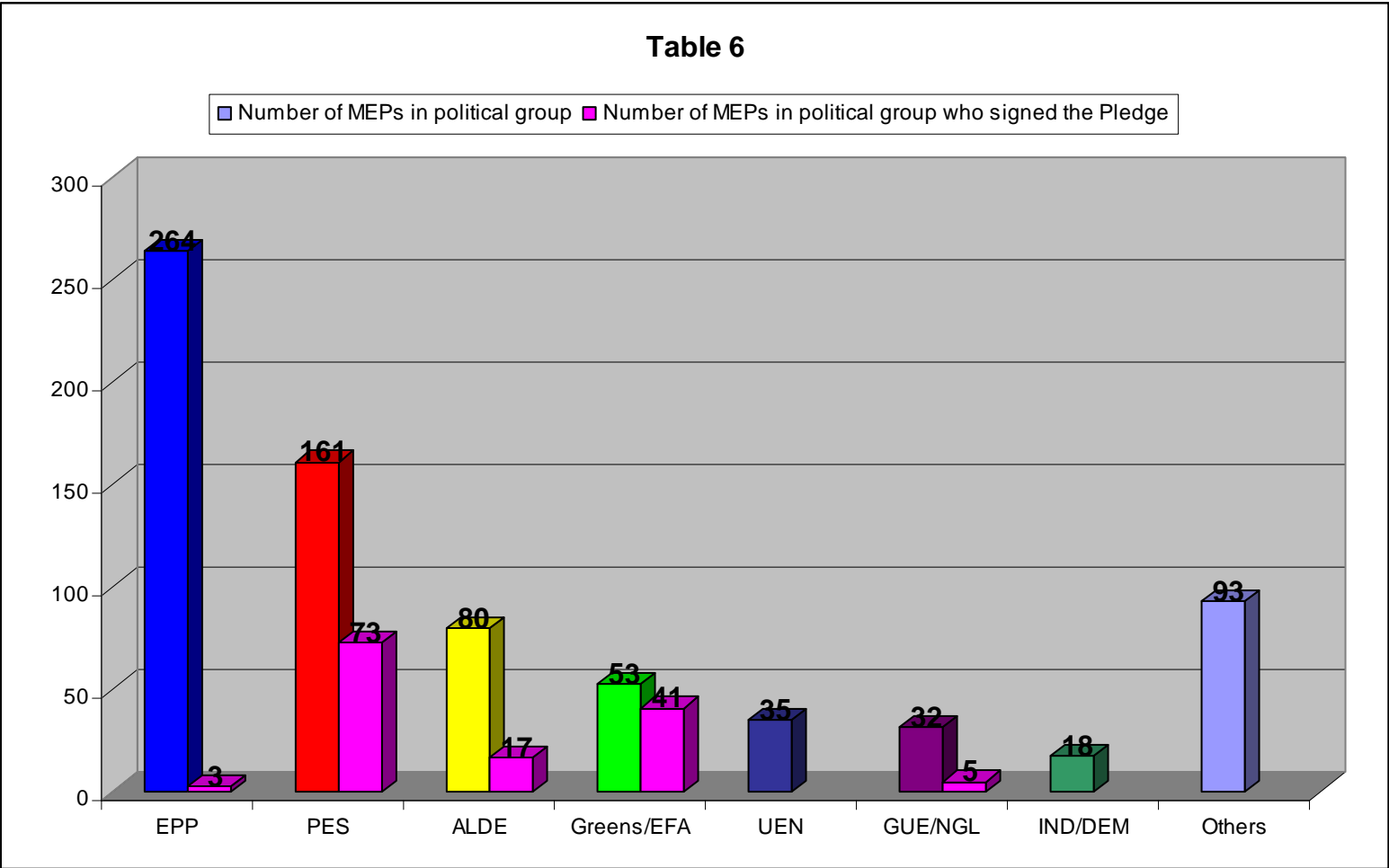
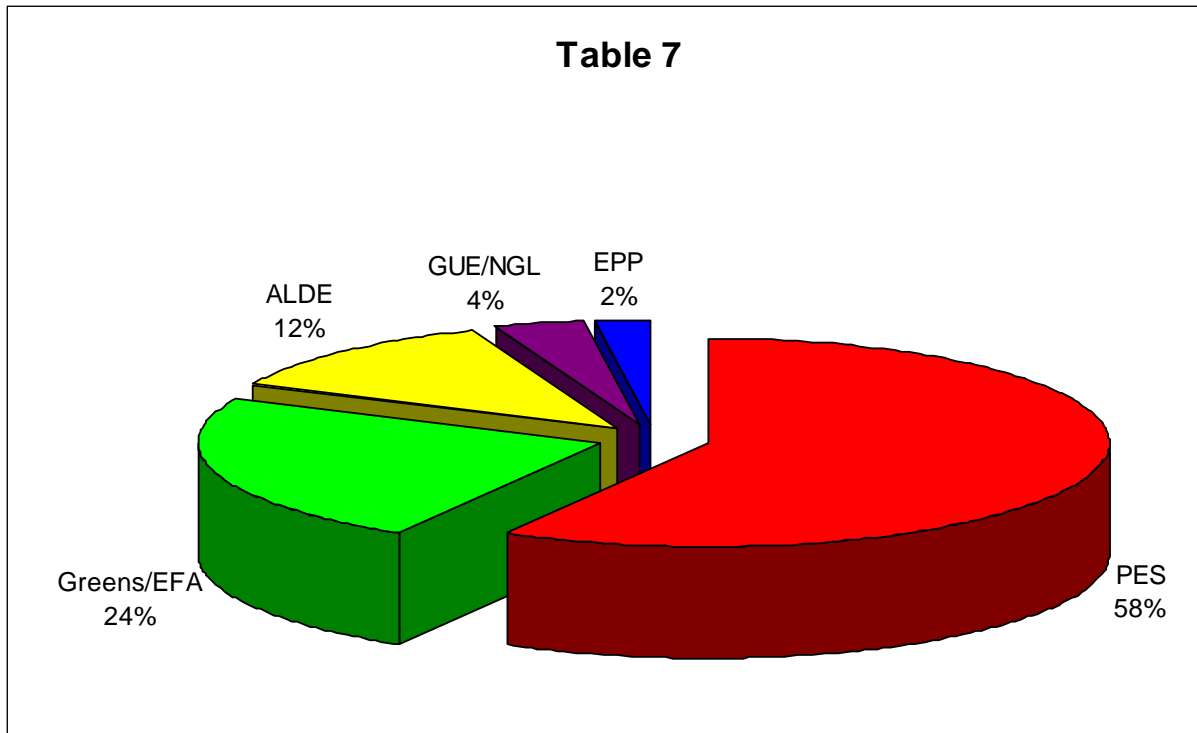


Table 6 provides an overview of political affiliation with the currently existing political group in the European Parliament of the elected MEPs who signed the Pledge
