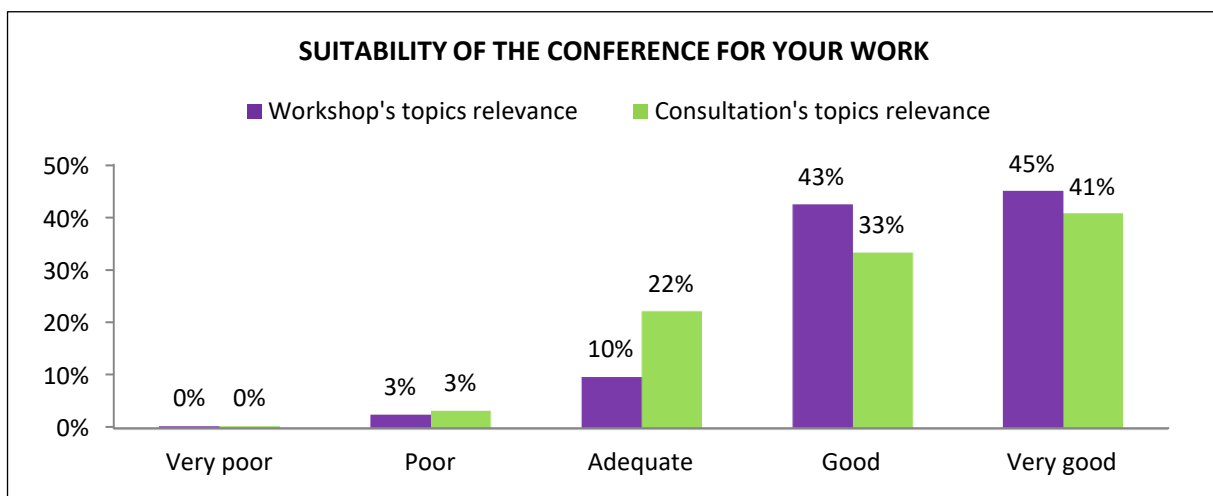
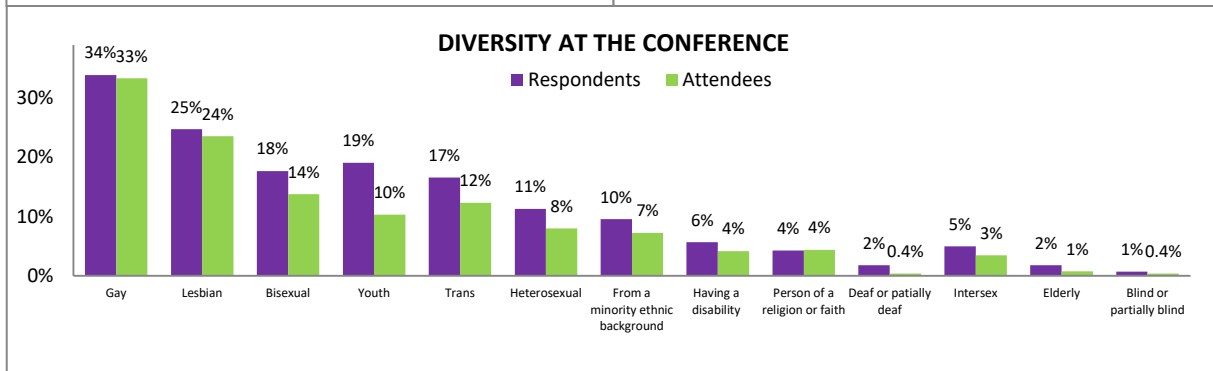
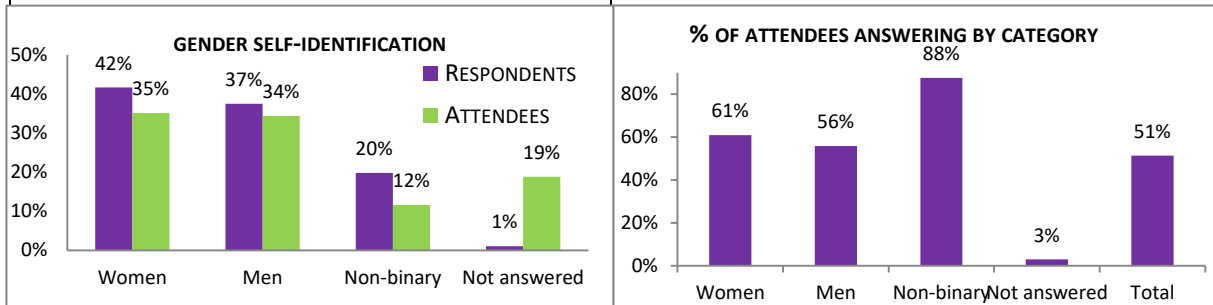


## Change! Communities Mobilising, Movements Rising

## How to have a better conference in the future?

- **Conference elements to keep**

Workshops are considered an important element of the programme nonetheless they have begun to share their prominence with other programme elements. In this regard, self-organised spaces have increasingly gained success along with consultations and research presentations.

As a cross-cutting element, the work on diversity and intersectionality has strongly been acknowledged as an aspect to continue developing further.

- **Conference elements to change**

The success of self-organised spaces and consultations has also come with the demand of incrementing their visibility and rethinking the format. Becoming an integral part of the programme after two years of their initiation, research presentations are seen as in need of being re-shaped and their selection process reconsidered. Finally, on workshops, a pivotal element of the programme, a demand for clarification on their level (beginner or advanced) has emerged.

- **How would you describe the space created for this year's conference and how did you feel in that space?**

A majority of respondents described this year's Annual Conference space as inclusive and safe. Nonetheless, the evaluation results shed light on the need to continue working on the inclusion of groups and collectives underrepresented in the LGBTI movement.

Acknowledging that there is still room for improvement, ILGA-Europe will continue its work on diversity and inclusion as well as on bringing up the intersectionality element during the preparations leading to the Annual Conference in Brussels at the end of this year.
